4th Grade Summer Journey Project

Theme: Exploration

Materials Needed: composition notebook, posterboard, map pencils, markers, open mind :)

Guiding Questions:

Why is exploration important to the history of mankind?

How do explorers contribute to people's knowledge of the world?

What are some character traits of successful explorers?

What ideas and discoveries have made exploration possible?

How has exploration changed throughout history? Why?

What role has technology played in the evolution of exploration?

Are humans finished exploring? How do you know?

Your Mission:

To boldly go and explore new frontiers, documenting your journey for future generations of 4th graders.

Main Products:

Exploration Journal: a personal summer diary, complete with photographs/illustrations of yourself and your discoveries on your journey; detailed entry paragraphs which include: dates, descriptions of events, discoveries, observations (sights, sounds, smells, etc.), as well as emotional responses to those events and discoveries. (you will need: composition notebook)

Map: detailed, illustrated diagram of your summer journey. Your map must include: a title, compass rose, a legend/key, as well as "pins" of locations throughout your journey. The map must be in color and may be annotated (examine similar maps, such as ones you would have for a zoo, Six Flags, etc.). BE CREATIVE! This map does NOT need to be to scale-that means you do not need to worry about sizes of objects on your map. (you will need: poster board)

Definitions:

Frontier - "Going where no man, or woman, has gone before": an unfamiliar area, wilderness, point of view.

Example: Exploring a new park, a new way of viewing others, challenging your own fears.

Journey - The actual process of traveling from one place to another

How did you get there?

Physically by car, bike, walking, etc...

Where did your travels take you? What obstacles did you have to overcome?

Emotionally: How did you challenge your fears? What motivated you to "take the chance"? Did you conquer your fears?

Did your current views or opinions of others change? In what way?

Exploration- the action of traveling in or through an unfamiliar area in order to learn more about it. *Pay attention to* specific details such as: sights, sounds, smells, tastes, feelings, thoughts, reactions of self and others.
